HOW THE CORONAVIRUS HAS IMPACTED THE HOLLAND CHORALE AND THE COMMUNITY OF HOLLAND SINCE MARCH 2, 2020:

- 1. On March 12, 2020 A Legacy of Song, the 60th Anniversary Celebration, was cancelled.
- 2. On March 13, 2020 Governor Whitmore closes all Michigan schools for three weeks.
- 3. Holland Symphony cancelled their Family Concert scheduled for March 22.
- 4. Tulip Time 2020 was cancelled.
- 5. Beethoven's 9th with the Holland Chorale and Holland Symphony was cancelled.
- 6. On March 20, 2020 the May 1 Chanticleer Concert with the Holland Chorale was cancelled.
- 7. Governor Whitmore asks churches and non-essential businesses to close. People were advised to keep a 6' distance between each other to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Social distancing was encouraged.
- 8. On March 22 the Michigan Governor orders all to stay home for a minimum of 3 weeks. Social distancing is required. Non-essential businesses are ordered to be closed.
- 9. Hope Summer Repertory Theater cancels their 2020 season.
- 10. Grand Night for Singing, the major annual fundraiser for the Holland Chorale, is cancelled.
- 11. On April 2, 2020 the Michigan Governor cancels school until the end of the school for all Michigan K-12 students. There will be no proms or graduation ceremonies. College students will finish their year learning from home digitally.
- 12. On April 3 Governor Whitmore asks that the Michigan disaster status be extended for an additional 7 more weeks.
