- 1. Budget report reviewed by Committee. Goal was achieved to be under budget for expenses. Net revenue approximately \$10,700.00.
- 2. Venue positive and suited for the current COVID concerns.
- 3. Quality singers and program organized by Patrick.
- 4. Michael Hyde, guitarist, excellent for social hour and dinner music.
- 5. Food was very good but appetizer line too slow. Trent recommended earlier start to program. Possibly before dinner ends.
- 6. Lighting poor. Patrick suggests possibly installing a low stage or a couple of sections of standing risers to elevate the singers by a foot or so. A couple of pole mounted light cans to put brighter light on the performance area. Trent confirmed the difficulty reading the music.
- 7. Trent had concerns over the sound system being poor as well as the electric piano not sufficient for event. A keyboard with weighted keys would have been better. He suggested chorale volunteers for set up. Patrick also would like a more private warm up area.
- 8. The Board will decide best option for GNFS next season. Discussion is relevant to best time of year within full season, Fall of 2022 or May 2023.

- 4. Appetizer line moved very slowly. Some of my guests opted out of appetizers for that reason
- 5. As it got dark, it became a little challenging to see the singers. Two possibilities...
 - 1. Install a low stage or a couple of sections of standing risers to elevate the singers by a foot or so.
 - 2. Use a couple of pole-mounted cans to put brighter light on the performance area.
